OVERVIEW

With compassionate support that offers a hand-up, Catholic Charities' Samaritan House assists women, families and veterans who need shelter, food and a fresh start. Through trauma-informed case management, we work with each participant's unique situation, connecting them to additional resources such as life-skills workshops, counseling, housing and employment help to foster long-term goals and independence.

EMERGENCY SERVICES



Many of our female guests who are looking for a low-barrier, emergency service option arrive through our newly renovated, clean and safe emergency overnight shelter on the first floor of Samaritan House. Guests will be provided a warm, clean bed, nutritious meals and will be matched to a Samaritan House facility that best meets their needs.

- Women should arrive at Samaritan House, 2301 Lawrence Street in downtown Denver, by 5pm.
- We are open daily, 365 days per/year.
- No need to call in advance.



CLIENT SERVICES



Of course, many women are ready to take the next step and Samaritan House can help. Our Client Services program offers an extended stay program for women in a dorm-style community living environment that fosters personal growth by providing supportive services like case management, goal setting, holistic wellness, employment readiness, financial and life-skill classes and referrals to community resources.

- This referral-based program serves women 18 yrs and older.
- Program length six to nine months and is a sober living environment.
- Women are referred to the extended-stay program at Samaritan House by community partners or Social Case Workers. Providers should email: CSReferrals@ccdenvr.org.



FAMILY SERVICES



One of the gems of Samaritan House is our Family Services program, which provides shelter, basic needs and client-centered case management to support families experiencing homelessness in their journey to stable housing.

Families are eligible to stay for up to six to nine months, with extensions made on a case-by-case basis. They are offered support to address barriers and acquire skills for self-sufficiency along the way.

Though each path is unique, Family Services takes a holistic and whole-family perspective to provide support for every member of the family.

- 25 private family rooms, with play and other spaces to spend time as a family.
- Warm, nutritious meals, clothing bank and hygiene items.
- Weekly case management meetings with as-needed follow-up and access to on-site career skills and housing navigation services.
- Educational workshops with wide-ranging topics: wellness, parenting, employment readiness, etc., as well as programming for children and celebration of birthdays and holidays.
- Resource navigation and the opportunity to meet with SSI lawyers, legal aid, and tele-health therapists, as well as referrals to various services including school enrollment, childcare, mental health and housing.

VETERAN SERVICES



Samaritan House Veteran Services is host to the VA Grant and Per Diem (GPD) program. All referrals to GPD come through the VA Healthcare for Homeless Veterans Walk-in Clinic. Veterans are welcome to stay in one of 36 beds in dormitory-style, community living for up to two years, given that they agree with shelter policies, engage in case management, secure income and maintain savings.

- The Program works closely with the VA and other community providers to ensure that our veterans have access to housing that is affordable and meets their needs.
- We provide support groups addressing PTSD for veterans, as well as person-centered case management services.
- All Veteran Referrals begin at the CRRC (Community Resource Referral Center) or the Rocky Mountain Regional VA walk-in clinic in Building A.
