THE FACTS

One in three children under the age of 3 live in families struggling to make ends meet.

- Food Stamps, Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) and Medicare cannot be used for diapers.
- The average baby uses 8-10 diapers a day.
- At \$200 or more a month, diapers become a luxury item for many families.
- Working parents say they miss, on average, four days of work a month due to shortage of diapers.

HOW TO HELP

- 1. Host a diaper drive at your school, business or community.
- 2. Volunteer and sort and distribute diapers.
- 3. Donate money to buy needed diapers.

THE NEEDS

Clean Diapers = Healthy Babies

- Parents report drying urine–soaked diapers and using plastic bags when funds run short leading to painful diaper rash and health complications.
- Early childhood facilities require a one—week supply of diapers for children to attend and most don't accept cloth diapers making disposable diapers essential.
- Diaper need impacts the physical, mental and economic wellbeing of children and their caregivers.
- Lack of diapers has a profound and complex impact on families, including health risks like rashes and urinary tract infections for children and mental problems such as stress, anxiety and depression for parents and children.
